Legacy of Learning

The Columbia Basin Institute of Regional History is a non-profit historical society dedicated to furthering the documentation and presentation of the region's human and natural history. They are centered in Cranbrook and work with regional partners to encompass the Columbia Basin region of British Columbia. The Institute acts in partnership with other individuals and organizations to preserve and recover the past. They offer opportunities to share in the development of public regional collections of historical materials, and in the benefits which that work may offer.
